COMPREHENSION POSTERS

Making resources available to your kids to help them problem solve and understand their thinking is a big piece of the independence puzzle. These mini comprehension posters (each is half sheet) are perfect for providing your kids with a resource to use when thinking about how to understand text. These can be displayed on the wall, placed on a binder ring, or however else you choose to organize them! When we're working on a specific comprehension strategy or skill, I display the matching posters on my focus wall. This keeps us all on track and accountable for our learning. These were created half size to help with space constraints. The visuals representing each skill/strategy are great for providing a thinking anchor. Because of their size, they're easy to use in a whole group setting or during a guided reading lesson at your teacher table. 33 posters are included in this resource.





COMPREHENSION RINGS



Laminate, print, cut, and organize onto a large binder ring. That's all you'll need to do to prep these on-the-go comprehension questions. The cards are organized by questions to ask before, during, and after reading. They include explicit and implicit questions as well as higher order thinking questions. Just flip to a question and prompt your students to answer. These comprehension questions will work with ANY text (guided reading books included).

Questions to Ask BEFORE Reading cards; 60
Questions to Ask DURING Reading cards, and
36 Questions to Ask AFTER Reading cards for a
total of 120 different comprehension questions.

ROLL AND COMPREHEND

Just add dice! That's all you'll need for this quick and easy way to implement comprehension in any setting... whole group (I love using a large die for this!), small group/guided reading, or one-on-one intervention and assessment. Just pick a card, roll the die, and prompt students to answer accordingly. These comprehension cards can be used as a game in a small group setting (first student to answer all questions included...or a set number of questions... wins!) OR they can be used as a fun way to engage your kids when asking questions. Roll and answer....simple, easy, and effective! 14 comprehension roll & comprehend cards are included.
